5. Trustee Report – Don Irwin

Firstly let me welcome each of you back as each School Council, parent, student, and staff play an important role in the education of our students and society. I hope you had a restful and relaxing summer and are recharged.

Work for the Board started on August 24, 2023 with our annual breakfast that we prepare and serve to all of the Central Office staff each year. Next that day we held our organizational meeting for the year and elected our officers. Cathy Allen from Sherwood Park and Susan Miller from rural Strathcona County were elected as the Chair and Vice-Chair respectively. Thanks to Trina Boymook and Colleen Holowaychuk for their excellent service in these positions in the last number of years.

The Board has just returned from a two-day retreat in Pigeon Lake where we reviewed the past year and set plans for the next year. WE also updated our education plan and investigated new program ideas.

Budget:

This year is a very tight budget as we have used most of our reserves from past years and now cannot accumulate much reserves to use for special projects.

French Immersion:

We are currently compiling all the information from all of the public meetings and the survey done in late June, and will be presenting the summary and the recommendation of how to continue promoting French Immersion in all grades. As space is limited in Ardrossan we have to move the senior high program and will be deciding about the junior high program location as well. The reports and recommendation will be coming to the October 19 public meeting and will be on the EIPS website on Monday, October 16 after 12:00pm.

7. Information Reports

Administrative Reports

Principal's Report – Mr. Wlos

- A number of new staff were introduced:
Mrs. Bennett came from Fort Saskatchewan
Caroline Dux comes with 10years experience from other schools
Mrs. Warwa (Business Management) came from SouthPointe School in Fort Saskatchewan
Sheldon Thompson (Red Seal Baker) came from Vegreville Composite, and will be the Culinary Arts Teacher
Jenna Parks (English Department) came from Stettler and will be teaching English 20-1
Glenn Brophy (Social Studies Department) came from Vegreville and will teach SS 10 and SS 20-1, as well as help coach football
Taylor Kitson (Science Department) and will teach Science 10
Kendall York (English Department) and will teach English 10-2
- Opportunity Wednesdays will again be running again this year. There will be Career Fairs (one in each Semester), and Club showcases where students can know what clubs there are and can sign up to join if they wish (one each Semester) during this time.
- Attendance Process this year is a little different with respect to lates and late slips.
- Grade 10 Assurance Survey from last year - data showed there were struggles the year before and we are looking to work on them through citizenship and improved parental involvement (connections with curriculum advisors, meeting with students, career fairs where parents are the showcase).
- Summer Update on Projects:
Gym: cut out some dead spots, next year the other gym floor will be done.

New Compressor System: Finance found some money through surplus, to upgrade the systems in the mechanical area, woodshop, and welding bays.

Fabrication Lab upgrade: paid with grant money. Redid all lines due to leaks. Four new machines were brought in and two old machines were removed. Dual credit funding will help pay for it. Facey has acquired Canadian Welding Bureau (CWB) Certification for Testing (welding apprenticeship and training). First testing will start at the end of November 2023. We are the first and only high school in

Alberta to do this testing, and it's open to all EIPS schools. A CWB person comes in to do the testing, Facey is supplying the materials and machinery.

Video not working signage was all replaced.

Air Conditioning project – two systems were put in and has helped keep the school cooler in warmer temperatures outside.

- School Startup:
Orientation Days were a big success.
Current registration is 1020, up 38 students from June when the timetable was built.

Mrs. Kropp Update:

- Orientation activities were done in 10 groups of 35 students. Small groups allowed students to feel more comfortable asking questions. Good feedback was received from students. Dodgeball was a hit (Chuck it at Chuck)!

Mrs. Bennett Update:

- Football, Volleyball, and Golf are underway
- Hudl is being used throughout the gymnasiums which allows parents to watch games virtually if they can't attend in person, it provides coaches video analysis, and students can be sent videos to promote themselves for post-secondary opportunities
- Club Fair will happen the last Wed at Early Dismissal

Mr. Schwartz Update:

- STAR for all grades to do Math and Reading
- Football is underway

Mr. Lawlor Update:

- Advanced Placement (AP) – allow students to take college level courses in high school
- AP Classroom – connects students to colleges
- Students feel more comfortable and confident (reduces stress)
- Transfer Credit – credit for AP courses taken in high school
- Will be attending AP Professional Development in Edmonton in September to network with other AP Coordinators to see what they are doing in their schools.

Miscellaneous Updates:

This year, the school has lost some of its previous technology abilities to convert speech to text for special accommodations. This change is due to a security concern.

Mr. Wlos will post the available School Council positions in the newsletter.

Annual awards for Grade 12s have been moved back to closer to University Reading Week to hopefully encourage/accommodate more graduated students to attend. This is when the awards ceremony had been previously scheduled.
