

Mr. Schwartz Update: STAR - Literacy / Math

- STAR: Literacy assessment tool used at all grade levels
 - Fall (Sept.) / Winter (Feb.) /and Spring (May)
- STAR: Math assessment tool used with grade 10 students only
 - Students do the assessment at the beginning of their grade 10 math course.
 - 1 time and will be done in both Semesters.

** All of these first Assessments will be complete by October 5th, 2023

Mr. Schwartz Update: Football

Sr. Football Team has a current record of 3-1 and are currently ranked # 7 in the Province.Started off the year winning exhibition games vs Cardston (home) and L.C.I .(travel) and then the start of the regular season 2 weeks ago. Next game is Friday night vs AOB @ Johnny Bright Park at 5:30pm.

Mr. Lawlor - Advanced Placement



- Advanced Placement provides students the opportunity to experience college-level work while in high school.
 - Curriculum aligns very closely with Alberta curriculum so the workload is manageable
- By enrolling in AP courses, students demonstrate that they are interested in challenging themselves and learning at a college level
- Based on studies of students at U of A, U of C, U of T and UBC:
 - Most popular courses: Calculus, English and Chemistry
 - Even with only one AP exam, students outperform non-AP students by over 11% (by over 20% with 3 or more exams)
 - 94% of first year university students said that AP gave them an advantage over their peers in the same class



Advanced Placement



- AP students have access to resources in AP Classroom
 - Topic questions assigned by teacher to check understanding and give immediate feedback
 - Progress checks give real-time feedback on topics and skills
 - My Assignments screen allows students to see what's coming up and view detailed results with links for further study
 - AP daily videos are available for all AP courses and cover the content and skills being taught in class





Advanced Placement

- More than 75% of admission officers surveyed said that a low score on an AP Exam would not harm an applicant's admission prospects
- 93% of students said taking at least one AP course significantly reduced the stress of their first year of university
- Semester one, full year and exam only students must make an exam decision by October 4th
 - Cost to write the exam is \$140
 - AP Capstone exam fee is \$200
 - Cancellation fee is \$60
- Students getting a grade of 4 or 5 qualify for transfer credit
- We strongly encourage all AP students to write the exams for the courses they are taking!

- Continue to visit AP classrooms this month to talk about AP exams, deadlines, and the exam fee.
- Available during lunch time for questions.






