my pleasure over the last few months to see firsthand the intense work and awesome results that our students have been able to achieve, and now tonight they will get to share that with all of you on the stage!



**Director's Notes** 



In 1909, the union movement in America was already a century and a half old. In theory, unions defended the rights of all; in practice, the pay and working conditions for women were far inferior to those of men. Thousands of young immigrant women, underpaid compared to their male counterparts, worked long hours under harsh conditions in the shirtwaist factories of New York City. In a determined bid to make union strength work for them, these women sought support from the National Women's Trade Union League of America and declared an industry-wide strike.

by a brave young Jewish immigrant who spoke little English, the Uprising of the 20 000 took Clara Lemlich and her fellow workers into the streets in November of 1909. Violent conflicts with the factory owners, the police and all-male union bosses did not deter the group. In February of 1910, the strike was finally settled, with the garment workers receiving better pay and improved working conditions, changes which benefited non-union members as well. That this occurred a decade before women were able to vote in America underscores the strength and determination of the garment workers to gain a measure of fairness in their lives.





**To** See the Stars chronicles this milestone for American workers' rights, and for the broader rights of women in society. The time, the setting and the intensity of this true story have provided my Drama 20/30 students with a singular challenge, which they have met and indeed exceeded. We have all learned a great deal, and I am very proud of the results that you see here this evening.




