1. **Call to order** at 6:00pm by Karen Tomnuk. Round “table” introductions were made.
2. **Additions to the agenda** – none. Approval of agenda by Cathy Jones, seconded by Amanda Beck
3. **Approval of November 12, 2020 minutes** – Motion to approve put forward by Marlene Crippin and seconded by Krista Scott.
4. **New Business**
  - a) **2020 – 21 School Fee Review** *\*see attached 2020 – 2021 Approved School Fees*

Fees are divided into 3 categories: Option Course Fees – fees for supplies needed to operate an option class, Extracurricular Fees – clubs and teams, and Activity Fees- field trip fees. Not all are done yearly and the approved amount is the maximum amount that could be charged so some of the time the amount charged is lower.

All fees are projected using the Program Budget Calculator. Teacher and administration will figure out what is needed for the program to operate and divide that expense by the number of students taking the class.

There are a few options where the materials required are very expensive and the student fee would be too high. For these, the school will offset the cost. One example is Construction. The school buys supplies in bulk where they can and this does help with costs. We do have to keep in mind the more projects that are done the higher the costs would be. This same formula is used for athletics and field trips. This process is very effective so the fees cover the costs without over charging.

There may be some courses this year that during the at home learning session students were unable to access supplies or complete projects. These classes will be evaluated for possible refunds.

Mr. Spady asked for School Fee feedback from meeting participants.

Trina Boymook: The Board does approve the parameters for fee calculations. Mr. Spady does a very good job at course fee calculations and has been used as an example to other schools.

Options and lunch fees are cost recovery. Activity fees may have a maximum 5% increase per year keeping mindful of family situations and making sure families are aware of fees well ahead of time. Also, schools make families aware of Policy 23 where fees may be waived if necessary.

**b) 2021 – 22 School Fee Input**

We are currently evaluating the fees for 2021-22 and will have them ready for discussion at the February meeting. The proposed fees will go out in the Flacon's View prior to the meeting.

**c) School Council Start Time Survey**

Survey went out and the data collected indicates the majority respondents wanted a 6:00pm meeting start time. The virtual meeting option was popular and we will consider a combination meeting in the future. In-person meetings lend to better discussion opportunity but adding a virtual component may allow for more convenient attendance.

**Parent Comment:** I appreciate being able to do that survey. I also appreciate all the staff who attend the meetings to give their reports. I think it is important to have the opportunity to have discussion and a relationship with the school staff. I have gone to other meetings and requested that there be staff present at those meetings as well to foster this same kind of effective communication.

**d) Alberta Education Accountability Survey**

\*Results are not available at this time, we will provide it as soon as we have it.

This survey goes out to all grade 10 families and to all grade 10 students. It is mailed out and there is now an online version. This survey provides valuable feedback to the school for improvements in every area as necessary.

**e) EIPS Returning Student Registration – February 1 - 28<sup>th</sup>**

Registrations open February 1<sup>st</sup>, all students should register for the 2021 – 22 school year. Those that are planning on attending a school or program of choice please ensure that your registration is complete before the 28<sup>th</sup>. All students not registered prior to the 28<sup>th</sup> will be directed to their designated school and changes will not be made after that date.

Bev Facey is an open boundary school and will accept all new students.

There are 389 out going grade 12's this year and only 238 incoming grade 10's (current grade 9's) at this point.

**Parent Question:** What is the projected enrollment for next year? Is there usually such a gap and how will this impact funding and programming?

**Answer:** This year's grade 12 class is an unusually large class. The gap is about 151 but we do expect this to decrease. Not being able to have an in person open house may have some impact. Feedback from previous open houses has been really positive. Student and family comments have been that Bev Facey's open houses feel very caring and welcoming. This has led to students choosing our school over another. Being virtual this may not come across. We are planning for a decrease in enrollment. It could impact staffing and programming but

we can't tell for sure at this point. We will know more after the 28<sup>th</sup>. We can discuss this again at the February meeting.

**Parent Question:** How can we as parents partner with you to promote Bev Facey?

**Answer:** Word of mouth, let people know what you like about our school and why you think it is a good choice. Social media seems to be working. We have students speaking about their experiences, wanting to do these and to post them. We will continue to let students speak and post their comments and talks.

## 5. Information Reports:

### A. Student Report – FLI Students: Devan Besserer, Taylor Christiansen, Chance Parker, Mitchell Pitters

Devan - Working to plan safe events to make students feel welcome and happy. There has been some adjustments returning to in school learning. I'd like to commend teachers for moving to online learning and then back to in class. I am proud of how well our school and students have been following COVID protocols. It all seems to be going very well.

Mitchell – I'm in grade 10 and so far so good. People are doing their best. The transition from 45 minute classes to 3 hour classes has been good and bad. It is good to focus on one class at a time but there is less time to do homework. Overall I am happy with the quarter system.

Taylor – I'm in grade 11. I like the quarter system. I found it very hard to transition and adjust to online classes.

FLI is planning a Trivia event in the gym that students can look forward to joining.

**Parent Comment:** I am happy to have students at these meetings, love hearing your input and perspective.

**Trina:** This is the first time we have done the first in school, then transition to online then, back in classes. I'd like the student feedback on the transition as well as the online learning. If it happens again what can we do better or what really worked well?

### Student Responses:

- It was a good as it could be. I liked online, I could work at my own pace. Get the work done and move on to something else.
- I loved that I could email my teacher and they would phone me back to talk and discuss the work.
- Did not like Brightspace, no-one knew how to use it.
- Online went well, teachers were accessible. It was hard navigating Brightspace, difficult to upload assignments.
- Brightspace kept crashing or deleting assignments.

- Living in the country we did not have the bandwidth for multiple siblings and parents all working online. Networks kept crashing. Could not keep up.
- Next time teach kids how to use Brightspace prior to moving to online learning. It was better when we figured out some of that program.
- Not a good idea to switch to Brightspace for online when no-one could use it. Better to have stuck with the program kids already knew. We just figured out google meet then had to switch.
- It would have been better to already have the material on Brightspace.

**Parents Comments:**

- Thanks for discussing that Mitchell. Changing to Brightspace was confusing and frustrating for my daughter and her friends.
- As a parent, I found the online experience very positive. My kiddo did well and I applaud the teachers for being so organized!
- I appreciated one of my son's teachers calling with some positive feedback about his class work. That was great relationship building.
- The advanced placement may be a bit different conversation if it's based on the quarter system experiences.

**Student Question:** Why are there English and Social exams when there aren't Math and Science?

**Answer:** Staff indicated that there were too many concepts and complications in Math and science and would evaluate students by their work. Staff felt humanities exams were still necessary and that it was easy enough for students to still be able to do online.

**B. Trustee Report – Board Chair: Trina Boymook**

Welcome back and Happy New Year. We have just experienced our first transition between scenarios on November 30 for our Grade 7-12 students while our elementary students shifted to virtual learning January 6 for three days. We are excited to be able to welcome our in-school learners back to the classroom on January 11.

At the November 26 Board meeting the Board adopted the final report and recommendation coming from the Value Scope Session. The Board has approved the recommendation that would request the construction of a K-9 school on Sherwood Heights site that would combine Sherwood Heights and Ecole Campbelltown into a K-9 school where the elementary component would be a single-track French Immersion while the junior high will remain dual track. Minor modernization of Pine Street while reducing the capacity of Salisbury through relocation of programs and the leasing of space, as well as a minor modernization. The plan will also include relocating surplus modulars out of Sherwood Park.

The Board amended the 2021-22 calendar to move the October 8 professional learning day to October 18. The municipality election will be held on October 18. We don't know where

we will be with COVID at that point and this amendment reduces exposure to both students and public.

Board has made a number of amendments to bylaws in preparation for the upcoming Trustee election, as well as, appointed the returning officer. With changes to in the Local Authority Act nominations opened from January 4, 2021 and will remain open until noon September 20, 2021. Please refer to Trustee tab on the website to access information for those considering putting their name forward.

At the Board's December meeting the Board has approved a Junior High Honours System Program which will be offered at Ardrossan Jr/Sr, FR Haythorne and Sherwood Heights for the 2021-22 school year. The program will be offered to Grade 8 and 9 students. Thank you to 1400 parents who completed the survey that informed senior administration recommendation and the Board's decision.

The Board also accepted the Superintendent's recommendation that EIPS will not participate in the 2021 Grade 6 and 9 PATs.

Returning Student Registration will open up on Feb 1 and will go until the end of Feb 28. Those that are planning on attending a school or program of choice please ensure that you declare that during the month of February to avoid disappointment. The following schools have closed boundaries for the 2021-22 school year.

### **C. Administrative Report**

a) [Barclay Spady – Open House February 10, 2021 6:00 – 8:30 pm](#)

I'd really like to thank you Trina. There is not a harder working person advocating for public education.

Open House – 6:00 – 6:30 pm there will be a virtual Welcome overview presentation. Then from 6:30 – 8:30 pm there will be the specific course program question and answer.

We have hired a company called Orange Fountain to create a Virtual Open House video for us. Part of that video is students speaking to a certain course. The end product will be a Virtual Open House of Bev Facey so students can explore the classrooms and hear from students about what happens in each area. There will also be Google Meets set up for each area where you will be able to click in and see the department and ask the teacher questions. The division sent out open house dates to all the grade 9's and we are doing a lot of advertising via social media.

Question to parents: We would like to also offer a google meet with the parent Council. Are there any members who would be available to chat with new parent if necessary?

- b) Cherum Orr – AP Open House January 28, 2021 at 6:00 – 8:30 pm, Diploma Exams  
AP Open House – 6:00 – 6:30 pm there will be a virtual Welcome overview presentation. Then from 6:30 – 8:30 pm there will be the specific course program question and answer.

The first portion will outline the program and the benefits here and in post-secondary. The google meets will cover a general overview of each class and questions and answers with teachers. There will be videos of alumni and current student's views, opinions and experiences.

AP – All AP exam fees will be covered by the division for exams this May only. Exams will be in person exams at this point but that may change. AP courses will be adjusted next year so that they line up with the May exams.

Diploma Exams – all are optional. One student wrote English this term and they were a challenge/upgrade student. One current student has opted to write the Math Diploma and the rest have all opted out.

- c) Matt Shudra – Transportation, Field Trip forms

Transportation - All school buses have a 15 year safety shelf life. Our buses have been aging and in the last 6-8 months we have sold 2 of them, the 18 seater with wheelchair access and the 24 seater. That leaves us with one school bus with 4 years left on it. We will have to see what happens when that one expires. It is too expensive to buy and keep buses. Not having these buses will impact athletics – students will have to find their own way to games. May be added fees to field trips.

Field Trip forms – we are revamping the forms. Field trips require multiple forms and time for the organizer. The goal is to streamline the process for both the school and families. Looking to put it all onto Power School for 2021 – 2022; a one stop shop. We hope to be able to return to going on field trips by then.

I've been working with the Orange Foundation to create a 360 degree virtual tour of the option classes. We have interviewed 19 students for the student perspective of these

classes. Hearing the students perspective has been great. This virtual open house will lend to the feel of the student experience.

d) Trudi Williamson – Grad

Our proposed dates for Grad 2021 are June 22, 23 & 24. More details will follow as we continue to monitor AHS regulations related to gathering limits.

The online Grad Wear store will be reopening on February 1<sup>st</sup>. There will be additional items, as well as an alternate logo as students requested a simpler logo. The link to the store will be emailed out as well as posted on the Grad section of our website.

Grads will be measured for their grad gown on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. At this time they will also receive their grad mask. They can use this in school as well as at the grad itself.

Grad photos will wrap up at the school on January 30. Students who did not make an appointment for grad photos are still able to have their photos taken by contacting Icon directly to arrange a studio appointment.

The grad list is out now and an updated list will go out in February.

Some students may get their diploma in the mail early but not to worry they will still attend the grand and receive their school diploma then.

We will be having a Grad Council meeting in February to talk about grad events and grad. Then there will be a virtual parent meeting.

The valedictorian will be getting a special stole to wear and the AP students will get the AP cords to wear. We are looking into how to honour our grad athletes. Even though they have been unable to play we would like to find a way to honour them.
