Grade K-4 Awareness

Students discover themselves by understanding their likes and dislikes and become familiar with the idea of "work." Hands-on learning opportunities and awareness-building resources emphasize the process of exploration over a final destination.

"What is possible for me?"

"How do I like to learn?"

Grade 5-9 Understanding

Students begin to understand opportunities available to them and connect those opportunities to interests they identified in the Awareness stage. During this time, students explore and reflect on a variety of experiences to help them plan their next steps.

Make plans and map out how to get there (Goal Setting)

Gain hands-on experience

Think about "next steps"

Transferable skills - want them to have good communication skills, positive attitude towards learning, work ethic these are part of every course.

2020 employers are looking for employees that have teamwork skills and problem solving

CTS courses are now grouped in clusters that are grouped within an occupational area

Work Experience component for off Campus Education

RAP (Registered Apprentice Program) allows them to work towards earning credits toward a High School Diploma/Certificate while working towards an apprenticeship.

GREEN Certificate - linked to agriculture. Students learn on the job, under the direction of experienced farm personnel.

CTS Apprenticeship Programs - taught by journeyperson for that trade.

CTS Credentialed Pathway and Certification - selection of courses that provide students with opportunities to explore and acquire information and values for a potential career. (eg: First Aid, Hunters Education)

Dual Credit Pathway - provide opportunities for students to earn college/ university credits form a Postsecondary institution and high school credits in select programs
