- June 13 raising of Metis flag at division office
- Central has tippee polls and rock clusters developing an Indigenous learning space
 - Trails cut into the grass last week, plants and trees added and connects to the bike paths so users of trails can visit the amenity as well
 - A space that schools may come and use

- Board last week was out to tour 5 schools
 - Facey being one of them were very impressed by Ken and Bev Facey
 - Good to see what schools have
 - Will be back on tour in Sherwood Park at the end of the year
- Trustees will review the Division's projected budget for 2022-2023 school year on May 19. This meeting will be livestreamed.
- The Board reviewed the information collected from students at the Student Forum. The information will inform the Career Pathway Strategic Plan, as well as EIPS Student Mental Health Strategic Plan
 - Highlights of what was heard
 - Discussed social skills and interpersonal relationships as it related to recent Covid experiences; students spoke about motivation to work, time management and learning from these experiences.

- Financial literacy, career expansion/exposure, post secondary and life skills were identified as areas for growth and change including a reevaluation of the CALM program
- Feedback in many cases was brutally honest
- Student Mental Health
 - Social isolation loneliness
 - Academic growth
 - Unpredictability created stress
 - Healthy behaviours to deal with stress
 - Missed experiences created disappointment
 - Isolation assuming students be okay on their own was a huge mistake
- Recommendations :
 - Students want a voice to be heard in their schools beyond events and fundraising,
 - mental health literacy training for staff
 - support trauma informed education
- The Student Mental Health Strategic Plan consists of 7 Goals. The Board's recently approved reserve plan provides the necessary funds to support the planned work over a 2 year period.
- Goal 1: Build staff capacity
- Goal 2 : Respond to Emerging needs
- Goal 3 : Supporting staff wellness
- Goal 4: Engage student voice

Surveys, round tables with various grades depending on the topics and questions

- Goal 5: Engaging parents and staff parent liaison workers 3 new hired
- Goal 6: Collaboration with community partners
- Goal 7: Improve school attendance

- There is a caregiver education series (virtual) being offered through Alberta Health Services which will focus on ways to support students mental health. These sessions are free and geared toward parents, caregivers, teachers and community members who want to learn more about challenges impacting children and adolescents. <u>Click her</u>e for more information.
- Brenda Kell, with the Alberta School Councils' Association, attended the COSC meeting as a guest speaker. She discussed the province's Assurance Framework; the framework's performance measures; and how it supports a transparent, responsive and accountable education system.
