#### **Director's Notes**



tis safe to say that of all the composers who have written musicals in the last 40 years, none has stood taller than Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. Along with numerous collaborators who helped write his book and lyrics, most notably Sir Tim Rice, he has had a huge number of hits with musicals such as Jesus Christ Superstar, Cats, Phantom of the Opera. Evita, Sunset Boulevard, Starlight Express, and of course the show you are about to see tonight, Joseph and The Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat. Joseph was one of his earliest works that built on the popularity of JCS, and solidified Lloyd Webber's reputation as an up and comer, with Cats and Phantom cementing it.

Andrew Lloyd Webber was born in 1948 in Kensington, London, the eldest son of William Lloyd Webber, a composer and organist of great note, and Jean Hermione, a violinist and pianist. His younger brother, Julian Lloyd Webber, is a renowned solo cellist. Andrew started writing his own music at a young age, including a suite of six pieces at the age of nine, and he has stated that he had set the music to (Old Possum's Book of

Practical) Cats by the age of fifteen. He put on productions with Julian and his Aunt Viola in his toy theatre (which he built at Viola's suggestion). His aunt, a professional actress, took him to see many of her shows in the West End, and through the stage door allowed him into the world of the theatre. Later, he would become the owner of a number of West End theatres. Lloyd Webber was a Queen's Scholar at Westminster School and studied history at Oxford, although he abandoned the course to study at the Royal College of Music and pursue his interest in musical theatre.

The story of Joseph's origins is fairly simple – Lloyd Webber wrote it as a 20-year old fledgling composer with a famous musician father who encouraged him, on a commission from a local school. It began as a 15-minute work, and as the years progressed it was continuously expanded and refined, until it became the full length show you see today. The show has had a huge number of professional stagings, numerous tours, and a straight-to-video movie starring Donny Osmond, who revived his teeny bopper/ TV variety show career with his portrayal of Joseph. From there, Lloyd Webber's rise to stardom was steady, and his collaborations with lyricists like Tim Rice, Alan Ayckbourn, Charles Hart and Christopher Hampton, and collaborations with great directors like Trevor Nunn and producers like Cameron Macintosh ensured his success.

Sirandrew has won numerous awards over the years, including a knighthood in 1992, followed by a peerage from the British Government for services to Music, seven Tony Awards, three Grammy Awards, an Academy Award, fourteen Ivor Novello Awards, seven Olivier Awards, a Golden Globe Award, and the Kennedy Center Honors in 2006. He has become one of the 100 richest men in Great Britain. He has had shows of his run for decades in both

London and New York. *Phantom* ran for close to 14,000 performances over 35 years, and *Cats* ran for close to 7,500 in its 21-year run. *Phantom* has earned over \$1.3 billion (US \$) to date! *Joseph* has become one of the most popular musicals in the world, with close to 25,000 different productions being staged since its inception. Lloyd Webber's career in musical theatre is the very definition of success.

Sirim Rice is a British born author and lyricist who was born in 1944, and began working as an articling lawyer until he jumped into the recording business, where he met Andrew Lloyd Webber. The two have collaborated on 6 different theatrical projects. Rice has also worked with Elton John on The Lion King and Aida, with Allan Menken on Beauty and the Beast and Aladdin, and with ABBA on Chess, as well as numerous other highly successful projects in film, TV and onstage. He has won Oscars, Tonys, Grammys, Golden Globes, Drama Desk awards, and was knighted in 1994 by Queen Elizabeth. He has been inducted into the Songwriter Hall of Fame, and has been named a Disney Legend.

And so, it is with great pleasure that we end our Bev Facey 2022-23 Theatre season with this family-friendly musical. We have a great group of talented and hard working actors and tech crew, a very supportive administration, and a group of dedicated teachers and theatre professionals who are working to make the experience of theatre come alive for our students, and for you, our audience. We sincerely thank you for your support of our wonderful program.


Mrs. Potiphar


