### **Academic Scholarships**

Christine Schmid Memorial Scholarship: This scholarship will be awarded to a grade 12 student who will be pursuing post-secondary studies in the areas of Education, Art, and/or French. The recipient will show service to the community, school, fellow students with a caring attitude towards others. Participation in community activities and extracurricular activities is also required. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$500)

Creative Music Award: This is awarded to a grade 12 General Music or Rock & Pop student who demonstrates outstanding leadership, commitment, performance and technical skills along with creativity. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$200)

**Elk Island ATA Local Awards:** The Elk Island Local of the Alberta Teachers Association awards two (2) annual scholarships to a child of an Elk Island Teacher who has been accepted to the Faculty of Education in an accredited institution and who has demonstrated a high level of achievement. If no one meets this criteria, then to a child of a teacher, not employed by EIPS, who has been accepted to the Faculty of Education in an accredited institution also at a high level of achievement. If no one meets this criteria, then any grade 12 student, accepted into the Faculty of Education. Elk Island Teachers Local No. 28's selection committee. Separate application required. (\$250 or \$500)

**Smart Photography:** The recipient of this award consistently maintains solid academics, is actively involved in a variety of school community activities, and contributes to the positive environment of the school. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$750)

Patricia Gau Science Scholarship: This is awarded to a grade 12 student who plans to enroll in a post-secondary program in Science or Science-related fields. The recipient should not be receiving another scholarship, demonstrate an exemplary attitude, effort, and genuine enthusiasm for science, and achieve a satisfactory academic standing in science. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$500)

**ServiceMaster of Edmonton Community Service Award:** This scholarship is awarded to a deserving student who has shown significant improvement in overall achievement during high school, has a strong vocational career focus and has engaged in the school or more broad community through service. Student must also demonstrate financial need. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$1,000)

### Leadership/Citizenship/Financial Need Scholarships

Inter Pipeline Discovery Award: The Discovery Award Program provides bursaries to grade 12 students who have financial difficulties and want to pursue a post-secondary education in an industry-related field. Industry-related programs include: accounting, business, finance, investor relations, machinist, welder and millwright apprenticeships, public/community relations, automated systems engineering technology, engineering or engineering technology, industrial instrumentation technology, instrument mechanic, or process operations. Inter Pipeline Discovery Award's selection committee. BFCHS staff selection committee to put forth nomination by **June 1.** Separate application required. (\$2,000)

Jostens President Award: The recipient of this award must demonstrate school spirit, citizenship, and extracurricular participation.BFCHS staff selection committee. (item provided by Jostens, 2023: watch)

Premier's Citizenship Award & Alberta Centennial Award & Queen's Platinum Jubilee Citizenship Medallion: These awards are given annually to Alberta grade 12 students who have displayed outstanding characteristics in citizenship, leadership, community service and/or engagement in volunteerism, initiative, and demonstrate a positive impact in the school community. Students can submit their name to the award to be considered by the BFCHS staff selection committee and then those names, with their full application, are submitted to a government selection committee. Application deadline June 1. School to submit separate application. Multiple recipients. (Letter of commendation, Queen's Medallion-\$7,000, Alberta Centennial Award-\$2,005)

Sherwood Park Elks Scholarship: The Sherwood Park Elks award two scholarships to grade 12 students in Sherwood Park who will be pursuing post-secondary studies. The students should be involved in school and/or community activities and require financial assistance. Separate application required. Application information. Application form. Applicants will be notified in late September, early October.(\$400) Applications due **August 31** of each year and must be mailed in:Box 57055 RPO Eastgate, Sherwood Park, T8L5L7

Sherwood Park Rotary Club: The Rotary Club of Sherwood Park will award six scholarships annually from each Sherwood Park high school. Each scholarship will be awarded to a student who has demonstrated significant academic improvement during their high school career, and who has made contributions to their school and/or community consistent with the Rotary motto of "service before self". BFCHS selection committee submits a name. The recipient will attend one Rotary meeting with one BFCHS staff member. (\$1000)

#### **CTS Awards**

**Battle of the Chefs:** This scholarship is awarded to students who have been accepted into a Canadian post-secondary institution in a first-year culinary program. The recipient must be a graduating student who displays outstanding achievement in food and/or culinary courses and an involvement and/or leadership role in the program. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$250)

PCL Local 488 Welding "Flame to Fame": This scholarship is awarded to the student that PCL Local feels best represents everything that an employer in the real world would want in an employee-someone who is a team player, punctual, has great attendance, good work ethics, and is willing to help others. \*please note: The recipient for this award has already been declared for the 2023-2024 school year.\* (\$500)

Kala Fresh Vending Award for Welding: This award is dedicated to a student who has demonstrated financial need and has shown a significant improvement in overall achievement during high school. BFCHS staff selection committee. (\$ amount varies)

**Elk Island Public Schools Awards:** \*The nominations for these awards have already been submitted by the BFCHS selection committee to the EIPS selection committee in early spring of the 2023-2024 school year.\*

Kevin Gaetz:Up to two students from each senior high will be awarded a monetary amount from the Edmonton Community Foundation for the Kevin Gaetz Award, which recognizes and supports students in their pursuit of post-secondary education. The recipient must meet the entrance requirements for the program of post-secondary studies to be supported, to have a financial need that could restrict the student's ability to pursue studies, and demonstrate a perseverance and commitment to post-secondary education. This could be described as desire and determination to pursue further learning in an area of interest. (\$ amount varies)

Konica Minolta: Konica Minolta wishes to acknowledge deserving students in need of support to pursue their career, education, and learning goals. Three EIPS students will be selected to receive this award. The scholarship recognizes and supports students who have overcome some level of adversity to graduate from senior high and continue their learning in any capacity. Students who demonstrate a strong work ethic, optimism, resilience, knowledge, and success in their pursuit to achieve their Alberta High School Diploma or Alberta High School Certificate of achievement may be nominated. (\$500)

WesTec: Dow Canada is recognizing two outstanding students in EIPS for their academic achievements, demonstration of innovation, and pursuits in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Grade 12 students must be in good academic standing with aspirations to pursue a career in STEM. Successful candidates will be selected based on their 300-word abstract submission demonstrating some level of innovation, creativity, and impact. Topic: Describe a time in your life--not limited to STEM activities--when you took an innovative approach to solving a problem that made a positive impact. The abstract should describe the problem, the challenges faced, and the outcome. (\$500)
