Director's Notes







Christmas Carol first started out as a novella by English author Charles Dickens, published in December 1843. It has never been out of print, it has been adapted into stage shows, operas, TV and movie versions countless times, and has become a beloved Christmas tradition in many parts of the Western world. The story tells of bitter and miserly Ebenezer Scrooge's ideological, ethical, and emotional transformation resulting from a series of supernatural visits (Victorian England was deeply interested in spiritualism, and Dickens played to this interest by including no less than four ghosts or spirits in his tale), and his redemption due to this transformation.

The novella met with instant success ten in a period when there was both strong nostalgia for old Christmas traditions, as well as the initiation of new practices such as Christmas trees and greeting cards. Dickens's sources for the tale appear to be many and varied, but are principally the humiliating experiences of his childhood, the difficulties he endured with his father, his sympathy for the poor, and various Christmas stories and fairy tales.

While it has been credited with reday to one of merriment and festivity in Britain and America after a period of sobriety and sombreness, it has also been viewed by many as a stinging indictment of hard-headed industrial capitalism, and the excesses which it sometimes forces upon those at the bottom of the social classes. It brings to the reader or viewer images of light, joy, warmth and life, but it also brings strong and unforgettable images of darkness, despair, coldness, sadness and death. Scrooge himself is the embodiment of winter, and, just as winter is followed by spring and the renewal of life, so too is Scrooge's cold, pinched heart restored to the innocent goodwill he had known in his childhood and youth.

We are extremely proud of our Drama and Musical Theatre program here at Bev Facey, and we want to thank all of you for your continued support of the important work we do here. We introduce students to great works of art by some of the finest playwrights and composers to ever set pen to paper. We provide myriad opportunities for our kids to perform in front of large audiences, and give them the confidence and the tools to excel in these pressure situations. We show them the value of hard work and team work, and the benefits that derive from striving for excellence. While our goal per se is not to produce professional actors, we are proud of the students who do choose to go on in their studies, and who enter the professional world and excel in theatre, TV, or movies - what a wonderful example for our students. More importantly, we are proud that our students go on to become lifelong patrons of the arts, which is what makes a society civilized. The great cities of the world are so titled in large part because of the artistic opportunities they provide people, and we are trying to do our small part here in Sherwood Park to give our students and audiences a chance to laugh, to cry, to think, and to feel through the medium of theatre.

We wish you and your family a very Merry Christmas and a happy and prosperous New Year! Enjoy the show.
